The post-aftermath of the 2014 Navajo Nation President elections, election officials were removed; and this resolution will exonerate the then-Navajo Board of Elections from further suffering from the sanctions for their contempt of court rulings.

The courts ruled that the Chris Descheenie, Navajo Nation Presidential candidate, be removed, and the board of election supervisors were in contempt for not affecting the court ruling.

Election Office is under the legislative branch, the legal question is whether the Legislative Branch has the authority to exonerate a legal ruling given by the Navajo Nation courts?
